Think about the news for a moment. Is there anyone who knows every piece of news happening in the world? No! Even the biggest news agencies with thousands of reporters can't know everything that's happening everywhere.

But Allah, Al-Khabeer, misses nothing! He knows about every big and little thing that happens. He knows when an ant leaves her home to search for food, and when a leaf falls from a tree in a faraway forest. He knows when you feel happy or sad, even when you don't tell anyone.

Al-Khabeer knows everything that has happened in the past, everything that will happen in the future and everything that is happening in the universe right now. He knows the people who are being patient and faithful, and He knows about the people treating others unfairly.

If you could ask Allah, Al-Khabeer, one question what would it be?



We all feel hurt and sad when we hear about the horrible things being done to the people of Gaza, Palestine, and other injustices around the world. Remember, Al-Khabeer is aware of everything; every tear, every cry for help, every act of oppression. Allah tells us in the Quran:

“Do not think that Allah is unaware of what the wrongdoers do. He only delays them until a Day when ‘their’ eyes will stare in horror.” (Surah Ibrahim: 42)

We might wonder: if Allah knows, then why doesn’t He make the bad things stop?

Think about it like this: When a teacher gives a test, she can see when a student is writing a wrong answer. But she doesn’t stop the student or correct them during the test. This doesn’t mean she doesn’t care – it’s just part of the testing process.

In the same way, this life is a test. Allah allows people to make their choices. Then, On the Day of Judgement, He will judge according to their actions.

This difficult situation is a test for us too:

- How will we respond?
- Will we show kindness?
- Will we help those in need?
- Will we stand for justice?
- What choice are we going to make?
