

As the people of Ash-Shakoor, we should be thankful too. We should thank Allah for everything, and we should also thank the people who help us or are kind to





us. Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) said: "Those who are not thankful to people are not thankful to Allah." (Sunan Abi Dawud: 4811)
